40kph coming soon!

At the Norwood Payneham & St Peters Council meeting on 3rd February, Cr Hugh Holfeld put forward a motion to implement a 40kph speed limit in two remaining NPSP suburbs, including Kensington, in the 2025-2026 budget year. The motion called for the limit to be implemented without the standard community consultation for safety reasons, as Kensington will be surrounded by suburbs with 40kph

limits. The motion was carried! Whilst we're waiting for the official 40km/hr signs to be installed, you can purchase KRA bin stickers to remind drivers to slow down on our streets. or receive a free sticker by paying for five years KRA membership (form on Page 4). Clean Up Day 2nd March



On Sunday 2nd March, Kensington residents will once again join thousands of people across the nation, all cleaning up their local area on Clean Up Australia Day. Meet Kensington's Clean Up Coordinator Peter Duffy in Borthwick Park, Thornton Street, at 9:30am. Wear shoes for comfortable walking, sun protection and clothing to suit the weather. Volunteers will be given gloves and sturdy bags for waste and recyclables, and assigned one suburban block to lap and collect items discarded on the footpath. In small groups we'll cover all of Kensington and regroup in Borthwick Park at about 11am for brunch provided by the KRA.

Join the Clean Up on 2nd March, but please do your bit for our environment every day of the year! The photos below show just some of the unwanted items recently left on Kensington's footpaths.

Reimagining Pioneer Park

For over 12 months the KRA Committee has been investigating how to make Pioneer Park more accessible and increase its amenity. As the Park in Maesbury Street is a Council-owned asset, at the suggestion of Cr Christel Mex, KRA President Roger Bryson made a verbal deputation at the February Council meeting, explaining the intent of proposed re-landscaping. The Councillors voted unanimously to allow the KRA to prepare an application for Green Adelaide funding to pay for the landscaping. A number of Councillors spoke in support of our Association and the positive role we play in the local community. The conceptual plan designed by WAX Design with KRA input is shown here and also online at https://www.kra.org.au/reimagining-pio-

Key elements of the design include:

neer-park/.

- Accessible entry pathway (DDA compliant) and all-weather perimeter path to allow Park access for wheelchairs, other mobility aids and prams;
- 'Light touch' landscaping without deep excavation to avoid disturbing existing trees and the cemetery plots remaining beneath the ground surface;
- Recognition and enhancement of existing historic elements, adding interpretative signage to honour both First Nations' people and the interred colonists; and
- Installation of paths, seating and plantings designed to encourage peaceful enjoyment of this precious green space.

Biodiversity Project Update

Volunteers have been keeping the Borthwick Park biodiversity project ticking along over summer.

- The summer watering roster is active from December until the end of March. If you see someone hosewatering thirsty plants in the park, don't be shy, say g'day and thank them for their effort!

- *Most of the seedlings purchased for winter planting in the Park are ready-to-plant tubestock (photo right), but this summer 300 plants are being grown from seed in a local backyard (photo far right). Several residents are propagating groundcovers such as creeping boobialla and karkalla (pigface) from cuttings. Volunteergrown plants cost the KRA less than \$1 each, meaning we get lots more plants from the project budget.
